A brief history of St. John's Church, Levens

Henry Howard, the twelfth Earl of Suffolk and Berkshire, bequeathed the whole of his Westmorland estates to his mother Lady Andover and after her death to his sister Frances, whose husband Richard Bagot assumed the name of Howard. Their only daughter and heiress Lady Mary Howard of Levens married the Hon. Fulk Greville Upton, brother of Lord Templeton, who assumed his wife's name.

In 1828 Lady Mary Howard built a Chapel of Ease, dedicated to St. John the Evangelist, at Beathwaite Green in the parish of Heversham at a cost of $\pounds 2000$. She also endowed the living with $\pounds 200$ a year, $\pounds 10$ per annum for the Clerk, and $\pounds 10$ p.a. for the repair of the church

In 1913 the churchyard was added and St. John's Chapel became the Parish Church of Levens, independent from the Parish of Heversham.
